John 1: 29-34

29 The next day John **saw** Jesus coming toward him and **said**, "**Look**, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!³⁰ This is the one I meant when **I said**, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.³¹ I myself did not know him, but the reason I came **baptizing** with water was that he might be **revealed** to Israel." ³² Then John gave this **testimony**: "**I saw** the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him.³³ I would not have known him, except that the one who **sent me** to **baptize** with water **told me**, 'The man on whom you **see** the Spirit come down and remain is he who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.'³⁴ I have **seen** and I **testify** that this is the Son of God."

Main Point: How to become a SEEING—SAYING—DOING follower of Jesus.

The History of Baptism

John the Baptist, who is considered a forerunner to Christianity, used baptism as the central sacrament of his messianic movement. Christians consider Jesus to have instituted the sacrament of baptism.

The earliest Christian baptisms were by immersion.

- Immersion baptism was not a Jewish ritual.
- Immersion baptism was the outgrowth of Jewish ceremonial cleansing and was performed after one believed.
 - Acts 19:4 Paul said, "John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to <u>believe</u> in the one coming after him, that
 is. in Jesus."
- John's baptism was a baptism of repentance.
 - The revelation of God happened after repentance and cleansing.
- Jesus baptizes with the Holy Spirit.
 - Note: Jesus does not decommission water baptism upon instituting Holy Spirit baptism.

The process and purpose of baptism is to create functioning Christians.

John the Baptist was a Seeing, Saying and Doing Christian.

- John the Baptist mentions seeing in some form 7 times in this passage. (Seeing, Looking, Saw, Seen)
- Speaking is mentioned 5 times in this passage. (Saying, Telling, Testifying)
- Some form of doing is mentioned 3 times in this text. (Revealing, Baptizing, Sending)

The Holy Spirit also operates in the arena of Seeing, Saying and Doing

Seeing: 1 Corinthians 2:9-10 Rather, as it is written: "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no heart has imagined, what God has prepared for those who love Him." 10 <u>But God has revealed it to us by the Spirit. The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God.</u>

Saying: John 13:16 But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come.

Doing: Hebrews 2:4 God also testified to it by signs, wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will.

Questions for small groups:

- 1. How can we better see and or recognize what God is doing around us? Are there tools that help us focus and gain clarity?
- 2. Where are you seeing God work at the moment?
- 3. Are you a saying and testifying believer? Give an example of the last time you testified publicly about Jesus and his salvation?
- 4. Being a doing Christian is not about works, it about an expression of God's love and power to a hurting world. Where are you being the hands and feet of Jesus?
- 5. Confession and repentance were keys to the revelation of God in verse 31. Why do you think that this is and have you experienced this yourself?
